2. Siler	B. Black and White (dark front, light rear, no facial strips)
3. Gray	C. Darkbelly or Badger (dark belly facial stripes, topline and legs, light body)
4. Black with Gray Tips	D. Lightbelly or Reverse Badger (dark body, light facial strips, belly and legs)
5. Black	E. Mantled (dark front, light rear, facial stripes)
6. Fading Red (colored at birth fading to near white)	F. Peacock (light front, dark rear, facial stripes)
7. Cream / Apricot	G. Tog (dark body, belly, light facial and leg stripes)
8. Medium Red / Copper Red	H. White Spots (white spots on colored background)
9. Taupe / Silvery Brown	I. Colored Spots (colored spots on white background)
10. Chocolate Brown	J. White with Colored Fibers
	K. Pinto (Colored and white patches)
	L. Belt (white band around middle of goat)
	M. Partial Belt (partial extension of white from the belly up the side)

Recommendations

The registry standard is tough, which ensure the quality of our registered animals. Owners are encouraged to know and understand the 15 traits of the Breed Standard used to evaluate in an inspection. In addition, be sure—

- the goat is in good body condition
- the fleece of good length of unmatted, clean, louse free (4-6 inches).
- the goat's hooves are trimmed.

Lactating does and bucks in rut have a more difficult time passing inspection. Remember that your goat will be evaluated by how it looks on inspection day; the inspectors will not speculate as to how the goat may look at another time.

Inspection Events

Inspections are usually scheduled around an event or show. Contact your regional director for upcoming inspection dates, or visit the CAGBA web site Event listing. It is possible for individuals to host an event, which needs to be coordinated with the regional director.
