1 Black	E. Mantled (dark front, light rear, facial stripes)
Fading Red (colored at birth fading to near white)	F. Peacock (light front, dark rear, facial stripes)
7. Cream / Apricot	G. Tog (dark body, belly, light facial and leg stripes)
8. Medium Red / Copper Red	H. White Spots (white spots on colored background)
9. Taupe / Silvery Brown	I. Colored Spots (colored spots on white background)
10. Chocolate Brown	J. White with Colored Fibers
	K. Pinto (Colored and white patches)
	L. Belt (white band around middle of goat)
	M. Partial Belt (partial extension of white from the belly up the side)
