

ADDENDUM TO THE CAGBA REGISTRATION PROCESS

RULES GOVERNING THE RECORDING AND REGISTRATION OF THE PROGENY OF ARTIFICIAL INSEMINATION

- 1) An artificial insemination buck collection form containing the buck's registered name, number, and tattoo /microchip or tag number must be filed with CAGBA. The buck's tattoo must be read and recorded at the time of collection.
- 2) At the time of application for recording and registration the owner of the doe will send a Record of Artificial Insemination form along with the applications for Recording and Registration.
- 3) At the time of service each doe must be identified by tattoo, microchip, or tag and the tattoo, microchip, or tag and description must be verified on her registration certificate.
- 4) The straw carrying the semen must be accurately labeled (with permanent ink) with the following:
 - a) The name, tattoo, microchip, or tag number, record number and registration number of the buck.
 - b) The name of the farm, business or person paying for the semen collection.
 - c) The word Angora
 - d) The date of semen collection
 - e) The name of the business collecting and freezing the semen
 - f) The straw color will be clear for Angora goats – most other breeds already have specific identification colors.
- 5) The Record of Artificial Insemination form will serve as a service memo for progeny resulting from artificial insemination.
- 6) Progeny of artificial insemination from imported semen will be eligible for registration by inspection, through the inspection process, if the buck collected from is not already CAGBA registered. The Record of Artificial Insemination form would still be required with the applications for Recording and Registration by Inspection forms.
